The Mercer County Sheriff Terry Ternes met with me at our farmland, on 5 May 2023, to view the most recent damage to our farmland (T146N R88W S34) north of Beulah. He said he would meet with the state attorney at the farmland to discuss the damage. He requested I email the photos to him, which he would give to the state attorney.

The Sheriff stated that North American Coal should ensure that damage does not continue and should install an approach to the farmland, so access is not blocked.

On 6 May 2023, I emailed the enclosed document, with photos, to the Sheriff. On 23 May 2023, I emailed the Sheriff that I had not heard from Todd Schwartz, District Attorney. The Sheriff responded, "I do not think it would hurt anything for you to Email him."

Also enclosed is the sequence of emails exchanged with Todd Schwartz, District Attorney, Mercer County State's Attorney's Office.

I believe Todd Schwartz is making statements that: 1) contradict the NDCC, and 2) falsely claim there is an easement that allowed North American Coal to dig ditches on my Mom's farmland and block access to the farmland. He has not sent the easement that he claims to exist.

I have never seen easements that do not require the company to restore the land to its original condition.

1) Does Todd Schwartz, a state attorney, lose his attorney license as he lied to the public? See email sequence for details.

- 2) Is Todd Schwartz required to take a report of a crime to the Court, so a Judge / Jury decide if it is a crime?
- 3) Can another state attorney be assigned to this case who will take this report of a crime to the Court, so a Judge / Jury decide if it is a crime?

I am 73, and don't want to spend retirement savings to hire an attorney. We did not do anything wrong. We should not lose money for a crime committed by someone else. Crimes are handled by a state attorney.
