Mr. Wrigley,

I'm surprised that you have not responded to me regarding the State Attorney Todd Schwarz emails. Attached are the string of emails with Todd Schwarz. The 17 Oct 2023 email is a summary of the emails.

Also attached are the emails with Mercer County Sheriff Terry Ternes. Jerome Boeshans was at the farmland when Terry Ternes looked at the damage on 5 May 2023. Jerome Boeshans' son, Jayme Boeshans, rents the farmland. Jerome Boeshans (701-870-6530) can confirm what Terry Ternes said.

The most recent problems for Jayme Boeshans is damage to his farmland equipment because there is no longer an approach to the field. The approach that had been there for more than 100 years (the width of the field, there was no ditch), was removed by North American Coal in 2011 and dug the new ditch deeper in 2014. North American Coal should pay for that loss of money (thousands of dollars – see third attachment).

Do you find it wrong for Todd Schwarz to make false statements numerous times? Do you find it wrong for Todd Schwarz to not take this to court and let a jury decide? Do you find it wrong for Todd Schwarz to contradict the NDCC?

Even if there had been easements, or a permit, I believe that historically the land would have been restored to its original condition. Are there any situations where someone can modify someone else's property and not be required to restore it to its original condition? If not, is this a crime?

We saw you on 20/20 - Dru Sjodin. We heard you state that you will leave public life if you determine that something is not justice. Will you do that with the items listed above?
